# From the desk of the Parish Priest Fr Declan

Parishioners may have noticed that earthworks have commenced to repair/replace the stormwater pipes in the garden surrounding the western portion of the Church. These works are being undertaken by John Kelly Plumbing in accordance with a Structural Engineers Directive to address extend brickwork cracking and damage rectification at the south west corner of the church through regrowing larger vegetation within 3 metres of the foundations and re-establishing an equilibrium watering moisture regime. This may allow settlements to be slowly reversed and result in external cracking closing up. Planting with new drought tolerant plants will follow. The cost of these works were included in the original Church Rebuilding Project budget approved by Archibishop Hart on 6th March

Our Solar Photovoltaic Panel System containing 58 panels started generating electricity for use in the Parish Centre on Friday 4th August 2017. The project cost \$30,000 to install with a grant of \$15,000 having been received under the Federal Governments Solar Communities Programme.

It is anticipated that the payback period is less than 4 years.

The Parish would like to thank Helen Kroger the then Federal Candidate for Bruce and the Hon. Greg Hunt MP the then Minister for the Environment for their assistance in gaining this grant and to parishioner Frank Holohan and John Kelly for initiating the request.

### Eucharist as meal (Part 4)

We can see that the deeper understanding of the meal highlights several important points.

- Forgiveness and reconciliation are implied by the fact that we are invited despite our weakness or unworthiness. We only have to accept the invitation. The chief means of reconciliation in the church is the Eucharist. We see it highlighted in the 'greeting of peace' where we extend the hand of friendship to those with whom we share, at the table of the Lord. We must be willing to extend the hand of friendship, forgiveness and outreach in the same spirit as Jesus. We are called to be ambassadors of Jesus and our ministry is one of reconciliation.
- There is a sense of solidarity and fellowship that bind those at the same table. Baptism has brought us into a family. Jesus comes to forge new bonds that go beyond tribe or nation. In Jesus we have a deeper source of unity. This does not cover over human differences or conflicts, but transcends them. If our Eucharistic celebrations are to reflect the actuality of our lives, we must learn to extend our reach beyond all limits. Frequent sharing at the Lord's table should fill us with the range of Jesus's action. We cannot isolate ourselves into a comfort zone and feel no fellowship for those we may never meet. Each person is an image of God and brother or sister.
