Eucharist as meal (Part 2)

In modern life many families are seldom together for meals. This compounds the problem. We can aid our understanding by thinking about special meals, shared on festive occasions, such as Christmas, birthdays or times we invite others to our table. Everyone enjoys receiving dinner invitations—not primarily for the food. The thoughtfulness of the one extending the invitations, the pleasure of gathering with friends, the conversation and conviviality all play important roles. If these are all present we can look back and say "That was a good meal" (even if the food wasn't sumptuous!). It is obvious that in meals of this type, the social relationships are the most important realities, good friends makes any food taste better!

If this is true for us, it was even more true in the time of Jesus. Meals were sacred. To break bread with some was a pledge of solidarity and friendship. During more formal meals there would be much dialogue and sharing. Jesus carried out a rather extensive ministry of meal fellowship. The scribes and Pharisees understood the meaning of meals and often objected to the people with whom Jesus was eating. The fact that Jesus was regarded as a rabbi by some and a prophet by others and that he would associate himself with tax-collectors, prostitutes and those who did not know or keep the Law as a clear statement of solidarity with these people. Eating with them made Jesus' association with them starkly clear.
